# MAKE NO BONES

## Make No Bones

Are raffles an untapped well of fortune for CKCOJ? The short answer is that they are worthwhile IF a prize of broad appeal is donated. Now here's the longer story.

First a few statistics. Raffle tickets for the Rie Munoz print were available for sale during a 7-week period. Tickets were sold for \$5 each or \$20 for 5 tickets. One hundred forty tickets were sold for a total of \$610 in gross sales. Nine members sold tickets. The highest number of ticket sales per person was 26. The next highest number of ticket sales per person was 23. The lowest number of ticket sales per person was 10. The average number of tickets sold per person was 15.5. The highest gross dollar value of sales per person was \$115.

Second a few necessary ingredients. Somebody has to solicit for and obtain a donated item of significant value and reasonably broad appeal. At least two members, one of which must be an officer, have to be willing to take the open book test annually to keep the charitable gaming permit valid. The treasurer needs to keep a separate bank account for gaming and file quarterly reports to the State Department of Community and Economic Development. Somebody needs to design and print numbered raffle tickets. A half-dozen or more members must be willing to sell 10 to 25 tickets. You also need a public event at which to draw the winning ticket.

Third some observations. Raffles, unlike most of our fundraising activities tap a different pool of resources - the non-member possibly even "dogless" public. A review of the ticket sales shows that over 80% of the tickets were sold to non-members. There is no way to tell whether these folks really were "dogless", but unlike our highly

**I. Call to Order** at 6:35 PM at Gabrielle LaRoche's home. Present: Gabrielle LaRoche, Aran Felix, Camille Stephens, Jill Grose, Heather Stockard, Susan Rasmussen, Perry Shipman

**II. Approval of Agenda** – additions, deletions, or corrections. Additions include to authorize purchase of the Santa suit under Old Business, and to add public relations discussion under Correspondence. Approval of additions M/Heather, S/Susan, A/UC.

**III. New Members** – Three new members approved. M/Aran, S/Susan, A/UC.

**IV. Approval of Minutes** – M/Heather to approve April 20, 2000 minutes. S/Susan, A/UC.

**V. Correspondence** – reviewed for action as appropriate. The board decided not to pursue saving A&P receipts as it was too much work for little return. Received a letter from Chicory stating we need to give her business cards and flyers so she can keep CKCOJ promoted on their bulletin board. We need to get cards printed but we discussed which phone to put on cards. Perry suggested a voice mail and moved that if a permanent service is no more than \$20-30 a month that we get this service. Gabrielle will research. S/Heather, A/UC. Sequence is decide on voice mail, then order cards, and reprint the brochure. Aran agreed to take them to the vet's offices and other locations.

**VI. Treasurer's Report** – Susan Rasmussen presented the report noting that the agility trial made a profit. M/Perry to approve

minutes. S/Heather, A/UC.

### VII. Committees

**Obedience/Conformation** presented by Heather.

**September Obedience Trial** – Don Golnick will co-chair the September trial with Heather. Gabrielle is in charge of trophies. Jana Lyttle is the judge.

**Other Business** – Puppy class starts June 8, Thursdays, 6-7:00 PM. Advanced Obedience started July 11, Tuesdays, 6-7:00 PM. A facilitated practice will follow the obedience class on Thursdays, 7-8:00 PM. All classes are at Harborview playground. Perry proposed to put on a conformation fun match two times monthly. The cost is \$3-5.00 per person. To be held at Floyd Dryden school. Gabrielle, Susan and Perry volunteered to be judges. Heather recommended they get volunteers, pick dates, and let her know. There was discussion about concurrently running a basic obedience fun match.

**Agility** - April trial report. The judge told Jill that due to a NADAC rule change, the slats on the dog walk and A-frame are too thick and need to be sanded. We will wait until spring when the equipment will be painted. Agility classes are scheduled: Beginner I starts July 11, Beginner II starts approximately July 23.

**Other Business** – None.

successful Pet Photos with Santa, participation is not dependent on pet ownership. This means that a raffle can be an effective way of supplementing our fundraising activities without competing in anyway with our other events.

Finally some comments and recommendations. Raffles can be a good fundraising tool. Donated artwork makes a great prize. I would not however, recommend purchasing a prize to raffle. This raffle was successful because all total costs (gaming permit, promotion and copying) were under \$100. Tie the raffle drawing to a regularly scheduled event such as a trial or possibly Pet Photos with Santa. Promotion and other incidentals are more efficient when events are combined. Do make sure you have a half-dozen or so folks willing to sell tickets. Plan for at least a six-week period for ticket sales. Set-up ticket sales at malls and shopping centers - not only will you sell tickets but its another venue to promote CKCOJ.

## CKCOJ NEWSLETTER ADVERTISING POLICY

Effective 3/16/00

**ISSUE:** CKCOJ distributes a monthly newsletter to all members. From time to time, members or others may wish to place advertisements in the newsletter. This policy sets the conditions under which ads may be placed in the newsletter. Commercial advertisements that are accepted will be used to subsidize printing and distribution of the newsletter. This policy will be in effect for a six month trial period.

**NON-COMMERCIAL CLASSIFIED ADS:** Members in good standing may, at no charge, submit short dog-related text classified ads of a non-commercial nature for inclusion in the newsletter. Examples might include: used crates or other equipment for sale, brags, litter announcements, homes wanted for rescue dogs, upcoming events of interest, equipment wanted, etc.

**WHAT IS NON-COMMERCIAL?** An activity is considered to be non-commercial if it is not from an activity that is treated as a business on the member's income tax return. A member who owns a commercial business may post a classified ad for an item that is not related to their business activity (e.g. personal equipment for sale).

**COMMERCIAL ADVERTISING:** Commercial ads or display advertisements (such as "brags" accompanied by a photo) are accepted from both members and non-members. Members receive a 50% discount off the posted rates. All ads must be provided to the newsletter editor in electronic form. In addition, a hard copy of the ad, along with payment, must be sent to CKCOJ (P.O. Box 32513, Juneau, AK 99803). The ad will be published in the first issue after payment is received. The following rates are charged for ads:

- **Business card ads:** \$100 per year or \$15 per insertion
- Annual insertion rates are for the CKCOJ fiscal year. Charges for ads placed after the beginning of the fiscal year will be pro-rated.
- **Quarter-page:** \$25 per insertion
- **Half-page:** \$40 per insertion
- **Full-page:** \$70 per insertion

**RIGHTS RESERVED:** The newsletter editor or the board reserve the right to reject either non-commercial or commercial ads for any reason, including lack of space or an item or activity being advertised that is contrary to the mission of the organization. When space is limited, new non-commercial ads will be given priority over ads that have been previously published. At this time, no breeder ads or ads offering puppies for sale or placement will be accepted.

## HOMEMADE FROSTY PAWS

*Frosty Paws are commercially-made "ice cream" treats for dogs. I never met a dog that didn't like it. This is a homemade version which I got off the Web. This recipe uses totally different ingredients, but like its commercial counterpart, I never met a dog that didn't like it. This recipe will make about 18 Frosty Paws.*

- 1 quart vanilla yogurt
- 1 medium banana
- 2 T peanut butter (I use natural style)
- 2 T honey

Puree the banana in a food processor (a blender would probably work fine). Add the peanut butter and honey and continue processing until smooth. Add yogurt and process just long enough to blend all ingredients together. Place 18 small paper cups (bathroom size) in a baking pan (one 9x13 or two 8x8 work well). Divide the mixture evenly among the cups -- they will be about 1/2 to 2/3 full. An ice cream scoop or a measuring cup makes the job easier. Freeze until solid. I transfer the frozen treats to zip-lock bags for storing in the freezer.

I know that Juneau isn't known for its HOT summers, but we still need to take some extra care to make sure our dogs are safe and comfortable in warm, sunny weather. Here are some things to remember.

- ☞ Make sure your dog has plenty of water, especially if left outside on sunny days. Take some extra water along if you take your dog with you on a hike. There may be plenty of water along the trail, but you might not want him to drink it!
- ☞ Be careful when taking your dog for a walk on paved trails on hot days. Young dogs and certain adults don't have tough pads. Even a short walk may cause painful blisters that last several days....This happened to Helli a couple of years ago after a very brief walk on the Brotherhood Bridge trail on a hot day early in the summer. Blisters on all four paws -- ouch!
- ☞ **NEVER LEAVE YOUR PET IN A HOT CAR** -- even if you park in shade. Pets are unable to control body temperature as efficiently as humans and just a few minutes in a hot car could cause irreversible damage or death. It's best to leave your dog home on sunny days, even if you are making a quick trip to the store.
- ☞ Keep your dog off the lawn after applying fertilizer or other chemicals which can burn pads. Do not use slug bait in areas your dog has access to.
- ☞ Some dogs seem more prone to overheating than others. Dogs can suffer heat exhaustion. Watch for signs of overheating --- heavy panting, tongue hanging out especially far and resembling a "spade", a glazed look. Many dogs will seek out water to cool off - something that's not too rare here in Juneau. If you have a hard-playing dog that doesn't like water or you are in that rare dry corner of Juneau, then don't allow your dog to overdo it.
- ☞ Foxtails (and similar grasses) aren't too common in Juneau, but there are some out on the Mendenhall wetlands. Once it dries, the seed end can become very dangerous if a dog gets one stuck in its coat, between its pads, or other parts of the body. The seed will work its way under the skin, resulting in infections. Foxtails are very common in most of Alaska and Canada as well as down south - something to be aware of if you plan to travel with your dog. 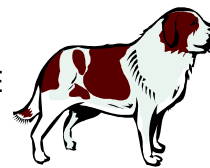
