REMEDIES FOR DOGS THAT ROLL IN ROTTEN SALMON

It's that time of year again. Those of you who fish are no doubt happy to see the salmon return. I'm sure my dogs, Mika and Helli are happy too...but for a different reason! Given a choice, I'm not sure if they would choose a freshly cooked salmon steak or a chance to roll in a slimy, stinky salmon carcass. I think I can guess.

I'm always glad to see low fish returns because there will be fewer carcasses tempting my girls when we go for a walk. Even if there's only one, they have a real talent for finding it. And then they look so pleased with themselves when they come back reeking and covered in fish slime.



Rolling in rotten salmon and other stinky things isn't strictly seasonal as Sue McGregor, a member of CKCOJ and owner of the Wee Fishee Shoppe, reminded me. My dogs have found fish carcasses in the middle of winter!

If you have a dog that rolls, you know how hard it is to get that smell out. A friend told me that tomato juice does the trick, but I've never tried it. Call to Order at 6:45 PM at 1603 Beach Drive, Douglas, AK. Present: Gabrielle LaRoche, President, Susan Rasmussen, Treasurer, Perry Shipman, Member-at-Large, Aran Felix, Secretary, Jill Grose, Agility Coordinator, Don Golnick, Obedience Trial Co-Chair.

Approval of Agenda – Add E. Trial Report under Committees, Add B. Facilities Committee under New Business. M/Perry to approve, S/Susan, A/UC.

New Members – M/Perry, S/Aran to approve five new members. A/UC.

Approval of Minutes – July 20, 2000 with corrections of Perry Shipman as Member-at-Large and Heather Stockard as Vice-President and Training Coordinator. M/Susan, S/Perry, A/UC.

Correspondence – Reviewed for action as appropriate. Jill received the \$500 check from Citigroup. Aran to write a thank-you note and coordinate with Jill to make sure it gets into the Juneau Empire Neighbor's section. Michelle Grose wrote agreeing to revise her engagement letter and send it to Susan.

Treasurer's Report – Attached. M/Aran, S/Perry, A/UC.

Committees

Training Committees

1. Obedience – Presented by Perry. This fall we will do a Canine Good Citizen's class and test. He checked with Martha Fishbach to coordinate. Becky Hinman, Sherry Violet, Deb Gillis, Lesley DeKrey, and Chicory Eddy all have volunteered to be evaluators. M/Susan to authorize Perry to purchase CGC evaluator kits based on Martha Fishbach's estimate on the number of interested participants. S/Aran, A/UC. Gaile Haynes is scheduled to teach a Basic Obedience class September 10.

2. Conformation – One more Fun Match is scheduled. Another set of matches is planned for every other Wednesday in the fall for 12 weeks. The plan is to show for five weeks, judge for one week. \$70 for 12 weeks or there is a drop-in rate. Possibly schedule a combination of alternating weeks of conformation and obedience fun matches.

3. Agility – A three-week break is scheduled between the last two classes. One more six-week session is scheduled before Christmas. Gabrielle saw ring gates for sale. M/Perry to offer \$200 for the gates, S/Aran, A/UC.

Nominating Committee – Perry Shipman and Bob Shaw were nominated. Gabrielle requested a short Bo from each candidate.

Awards Committee – This committee is trying to figure out how to track awards such as dog titles and achievements from this past year. In the future, this will be an Awards Committee assignment. In the meantime, Perry and Jill will reread past newsletters and contact people to determine who needs awards/certificates/pins. M/Perry, S/Susan approving Jill to purchase 50 Nadac pins. A/UC. Perry

discussed the Awards Committee idea of a Perpetual Award. No board members can be nominated. M/Susan, S/Aran approving Perry's purchase of a Perpetual Award costing approximately \$200. A/UC.

Historian/Librarian – no report

Trial Report – Letters are mailed requesting donations for trophies. Some people are donating items. Gabrielle notified Susan that she has fronted money for purchasing trophies and money will be coming in to cover these purchases. Discussion on whether to continue purchasing Bloodline photos. We will pay for High in Trial in Bloodlines, one club award per day.

New Business

Draft FY2001 Goals – The Board will handout a draft of 2000-01 goals at Annual Meeting, and report on 1999-2000 goal status, accomplishments, and proposals. Before the September meeting, board members are to email goal wish list to Gabrielle.

Facilities Committee – Perry reported on a site having strong possibilities for club use. Perry will try to arrange a time for the board to view the location.

Old Business

Constitution/By-Law and Policies Review – Only a few comments received. Gabrielle proposes a special mailing of By-Laws and Constitution with proposed changes with the invitation to the annual board meeting. M/Perry to approve this mailout, S/Susan, A/UC.

Doggie Dollar six-month evaluation – A long discussion involving who gets DD? How should the club account for DD? Originally, DD were to be used to reward volunteerism at money-making events. Should they be extended? M/Aran, S/Susan to award the Trial Secretary and Chief Ring Steward DD. A/no objection. M/Susan to award DD for newsletter, S/Aran, A/no objection. No retroactive awards. Much discussion ensued on our decisions resulting in M/Aran to reconsider distribution of DD at a later date, S/Susan, A/UC. Possibly the Training Coordinator or delegate to record and tract DD. Is it helpful to have the person who collects revenue for an activity also report the received DD as cash? It is necessary to discuss the accounting of DD with auditor. M/Susan that the schedule for awarding and redeeming DD remain unchanged at this time, and Perry will keep a spreadsheet of DD by groups. S/Perry, A/UC.

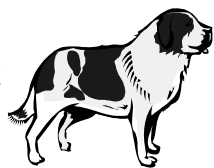

leaves coats clean and shiny. Nilodor shampoo is available locally at Wee Fishie. Or, you can order it from J-B Wholesale Pet Supplies through the Club's online mall (<http://home.gci.net/~cstephens/ckcoj/shop.htm>) or by calling 800-526-0388.

What do you do if your dog rolls and you don't have any deodorizing shampoo? Sue McGregor told me that Marilyn Coffman (former owner of Highlander Grooming) used to recommend **1/2 vinegar and 1/2 Dawn dish soap** as a very effective "de-salmonizer", followed by a shampoo with a good dog shampoo. Becky Hinman (a club member and GHS employee) swears by **Dawn dish soap** when Rex rolls in salmon.
