A year has come and gone and with it, a tail-waggin' list of accomplishments for CKCOJ! Last October the membership laid out an ambitious list of goals. All 12 have been accomplished or are well underway. Starting from the top, we sought and obtained NADAC affiliation, purchased and constructed agility equipment and held our first agility trial in April! Three seminars were offered: Suzanne Clothier, Mike Neil and J'Anna Little. To increase public awareness club members published brochures and flyers, expanded the website, reformatted the newsletter,

gained recognition in the local media and instituted DOG-E-WAG: a permanent phone number and voice-mail system. Members have continued to research the possibility of renting a "permanent" facility, first at the Mendenhall Mall and currently in Lemon Creek. Consideration was also given to a variety of scenarios to increase the number of obedience trials - change to a less expensive venue, 3-day trials or concurrent trials - but limited support for existing trials has hampered progress. The number classes was increased overall with a significant contribution coming from the supporters and participants in agility and a respectable number of basic obedience classes offered throughout the year. Increasing the number of instructors remains one of the more difficult goals to attain. Efforts are underway to develop a training curriculum that may in turn help recruit new instructors. Member-

CKCoJ: Facility Acquisition Questionnaire

As you may be aware, your Capital Kennel Club of Juneau is currently considering the acquisition of a two thousand square foot facility to be used for a classroom, training, and practice area. The monthly rental cost of the currently considered facility would be approximately \$1000 per month with an additional heating cost of approximately \$40 per month.

The proposed CKCoJ facility is located in the Lemon Creek area. It is found on the street immediately behind the NBA branch located at the corner of the road turning off of Glacier Hwy. towards Costco.

The facility is a warehouse, one of three occupying its building. It is 40 x 50 feet in size, with two single garage doors, two normal doors, and two windows. There is a rest room and the space is heated. There is a large graded vacant lot directly behind this building that might be usable for some agility.

This building is heated using oil. The tenant in the 25 x 40 space that is next to this space in the same building has told us that she has spent approximately \$700 in oil to heat her space during the last two years. Note that her space is half the size of this space.

We have heard from two sources, including the woman mentioned above, that the landlord is very easy to get along with and is responsive to problems. We have been told by a local realtor who is a friend that we can expect to pay about 50 cents per square foot for this type of space.

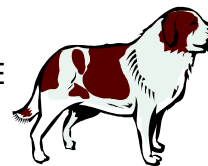
