Ketchikan Agility Trial

Ernesta Ballard of the Ketchikan club passes on this message regarding the upcoming agility trial. "Please be sure your club members know that we will be offering all three of the new NADAC games: tunnelers (all tunnels); touch and go (tunnels and contact obstacles); and weavers (weave poles and tunnels). We have permission from NADAC to offer official scoring so you can earn legs for new titles even though these classes do not officially begin until April 1. I an exhibitor is entered for the entire weekend at the \$75 price, all additional runs are included. If an exhibitor is going to pay per run, then each run is \$10. We have not reprinted the premium. We need to know by mid-week the week before the trial which, if any games each exhibitor wants to enter on each day. NADAC will not allow more than 6 runs per day per dog. Additional payment, if any is due, can be made in person at the trial. All dogs will be novices in the new games regardless of other titles." Mixed Breeds are WELCOME!

But my dog isn't a purebred, you say! What is there in Capital Kennel Club for me? Well... lots! That is one reason our club chose to be affiliated with the United Kennel Club (UKC).

Early on, club members realized that Juneau was too small a community to exclude the majority of dogs and dog owners by restricting membership to people with purebreds. The United Kennel Club allows for registration of mixed breed dogs, and our club holds two licensed obedience trials each year, in which all dogs registered with the UKC are invited to participate.

One of those trials is coming up, March 16 and 17, and if you haven't been to an obedience trial before I would encourage you to attend, and see what some of Juneau's finest mixed breed and purebred dogs and their owners have accomplished! The trial will be held at Mt. Jumbo gym in Douglas, and it starts at 9:00 am both Saturday and Sunday.

If formal obedience isn't your thing, your mixed breed dog can participate in other activities with the club, such as:

Rally Obedience -- much less "formal" than what you'll see at the trial this month, and some feel more fun for both the dog and owner since the use of praise and even food is allowed. We have a Rally Obedience seminar and trial scheduled this May.

Agility -- gaining popularity all the time, CKCoJ now offers puppy, beginning and advanced classes, and sponsors one licensed trial each year, plus many members travel to other locations (Whitehorse, Anchorage, and Ketchikan) to participate in other club's trials. Our club also participates in 4th of July activities with an agility demonstration at Sandy Beach, always a good time for everyone involved. We have an agility seminar scheduled in June, and a trial scheduled in July.

So, those of you with those wonderful, talented, dogs of mixed heritage – come on out! This is your club too!

Rally-O Class

The next Rally Obedience class will run from March 20 – April 24 and will be co-taught by Alexis Rippe and Heather Stockard. This class is intermediate level, designed for dogs and handlers that have had some introduction to Rally Obedience or are experienced in competitive obedience. Each week we will have a short course and a long course set up. The instructors will offer coaching as teams practice each course and will provide individual instruction on any exercises that are causing the teams trouble. The class will be Wednesday nights, 7 – 8 p.m. in the Mendenhall Mall (former Jensen’s location). Cost is \$50. Please submit registration form below.

Rally-O Practice: Beginning in early to mid-April (depending on weather) we will begin holding Rally Obedience practice on Monday nights from 6:30 – 7:30 p.m. at the Harborview covered playground. We will have someone designated to set up a course before the start of each class. The practice is open to any club member who has paid the \$10 per summer fee for use of the playgrounds (you can pay at the first practice if you wish). No registration is necessary, but please let

Rally-O Seminar

The seminar and trials with judge Lisa Wright will be the weekend of May 3 – 5. The registration and entry forms will be in the next newsletter. Our tentative plan is to have a Friday night session on introductory rally obedience that will cover the basics of the exercises. On Saturday morning will be an intermediate level session covering tips for those competing in Level I trials. Midday on Saturday will be an advanced session covering Level II exercises (including how to teach them) and how to judge rally obedience trials (which is also useful information for those being judged!). Saturday afternoon, we will have a fun match judged (under Lisa’s supervision) by people interested in becoming rally judges. On Sunday, we will have one or two sanctioned trials. Each session will be priced separately, so you can choose to attend any or all of the sessions that interest you. There will also be an all-inclusive weekend price.
