Shootin' the Breeze

To Breed or not to Breed... That is the Question!

I've been faced with a dilemma lately. I have a bitch I've decided to breed, after much research into pedigrees, trips to shows and specialties, testing for any genetic problems, training for what the breed was meant to do, and time and money spent on all of the above... Then, because of the research I've done, I was asked to give assistance with the breeding of a bitch belonging to someone who has done none of the above, who simply owns a bitch and is fortunate enough to know someone who has a "suitable" (in other words, intact) male. Should I be of help? When is it OK to breed? People obviously have different ideas about what is OK... Is it my responsibility to help someone out who doesn't want to do her "homework"?

Recently there was an article in our local newspaper about a breeder in a nearby town who, after breeding many times over the period of several years, shipping puppies all over the country, decided that he no longer wanted to be a breeder; it was too inconvenient! So he turned his 30 plus dogs, including 2 females ready to whelp, over to a small animal rescue

organization. He felt this was the appropriate way to deal with his problem. Now the rescue organization is struggling with what to do with all of his dogs. In the "Pets" section of the same newspaper, someone else placed an ad looking for a dog of this same breed with whom to breed their dog...I had to wonder, is it starting all over again?

What I ended up doing with the person who requested my assistance was to ask her questions. What is your dog's OFA rating? Have you shown your dog? How do you know it's a good example of the breed? Do you know what genetic problems are common for your breed? And has your dog been tested for these? What do you know about your dog's parents? Of course, the same questions apply to the male as well. Do you have homes lined up for all the pups? Have you talked with those people about particular traits of your breed, and what it takes to provide a good home for the pups? Etc. etc. etc...

After several emails back and forth, I stopped hearing from the person. I heard from a third party that she was re-thinking the breeding.

American Red Cross First Aid For Dogs and Cats

The Southeast Chapter of The American Red Cross is excited to introduce Pet First Aid starting in September. The class prepares the pet caregiver for sudden life threatening emergencies, and to recognize the importance of getting professional help as soon as possible. As defined in the Pet First Aid instructor's manual:

"Pet First Aid is the immediate and temporary care given to an injured animal until it can be taken to a veterinarian for more definite medical care and attention."

The class is 4 hours in length and uses a training video, text and actual hands on practice with pet manikins. The manikins allow participants to actually practice CPR, bandaging and splinting techniques.

The class will cover:

- Conscious choking
- Unconscious choking
- Signals of Cardiac Arrest
- How to administer CPR - on small, large and giant breeds
- Types of wounds
- Shock
- Heat (Thermal) burns - chemical burns - electrical burns
- Muscle, bone or joint injury
- Sudden illness including bloat and torsion
- Snakebite
- Insect bites and animal bites
- Poisoning
- Frostbite, hypothermia, heatstroke, car or motion sickness
- And how to prepare for disasters



Although this is a lot of material to cover in 4 hours, it will give the individual tools to recognize some of these life threatening situations and how important it will be to get the animal professional help as soon as possible.

We are very excited about this class and hope you will be also. After the pilot class in Juneau is underway, we hope to train other instructors in the outlying communities so we can help save more animals lives.

The cost of the class will be \$35.00. The participant will get a textbook to go home with. We will also provide pet first aid kits if anyone wishes to purchase one. In addition, each participant will receive a "Has attended" certificate for "Pet First Aid for Dogs and Cats."

Class size is limited to 10 participants and will be held in the Red Cross training room.
