HOW TO USE THIS ENTRY FORM:



- All entries must be submitted on the official "UKC Entry Form".
- You may use one entry form to enter the same dog in more than one event on the same weekend.
- Use separate entry form for each dog to be entered in a club's event.
- Dog not UKC registered? Apply for a Temporary Listing Number (TL) online at <https://host.securelook.com/uksec/tlapp.html>. TL numbers are valid for 60 days - fee \$12.00. (Fees are non-transferable and do not apply to the cost of permanent registration.)
- Mail all completed entry forms to the Event Secretary listed under the event; unless otherwise specified.
- Make all fees payable to the host club.
- Obedience Trials, Agility Trials and Weight Pull events are open to all UKC recognized breeds and mixed bred dogs with a valid Limited Privilege number.
- Obedience only: Check the box provided to request either the Veteran or Special Jump height option. Veteran dogs must be 8 years or older. Eligible dogs for Special Jump Height are outlined in the current rules and regulations.

We want you to keep the points earned at licensed UKC events.

Important things to remember

- All dogs entering UKC events must be permanently registered, have a valid Temporary Listing Number, or a Limited Privilege number for performance events.
- All entry forms must be complete and signed. Incorrect information submitted on the entry form may invalidate your wins.
- To be eligible to enter into the Breeder/Handler class, you must be one of the breeders of record, or a member of the immediate family of one of the breeders of record. Immediate family includes: spouse, parent, step-parent, child, step-child, brother or sister.

All events are held under the Official Rules and Regulations of the United Kennel Club, Inc. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs will be allowed on the grounds or in the buildings on the day of a UKC-licensed event. UKC, its agents and employees, and the host club assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by spectators or by exhibitors and handlers, or to any of their dogs or property, and further assume no responsibility for injury to children not under the control of their parents or guardians. UKC and the host club are not responsible for loss, accidents or theft. By signing this form, I hereby agree to waive any claim, action, or lawsuit and further agree to indemnify and hold UKC, the host club and any approved UKC Judge harmless from any claims, actions or lawsuits resulting from my participation in this event, and any action, decision or judgment made by any UKC or host club representative or approved Judge under the official UKC Rules and Regulations governing this event. "Sequimming Lessons"

The best reason for me to have gone to Sequim is that Copper completed his AKC championship with back-to-back BOBs. The two worst reasons were an all-time heat record of 100 degrees and a really long complicated drive from Sea-Tac.

Superintendent BaRay has a complicated web site but, once that was past, went out of their way to be helpful. The show site was pleasant and had enough breeze that the heat was not too oppressive. There was good competition in several breeds -- not mine, which had just enough. They did some rather amateurish Freestyle exhibitions at the noon break Sunday.

I stayed at the Econo-Lounge, which had, in addition to good air conditioning, a microwave and refrigerator in the room, and served a good continental breakfast, plus pleasant service.

The heat took all my appetite, which was lucky as Sequim has nowhere to get anything like good food --The Three Crabs had ben recommended, but only served Dungeness and considering the hostess' manners, we left, deciding the other two (crabs) were the staff. There was a nice "family style" restaurant next to the Econo-Lounge -- huge portions, friendly service.

Judges and competition will of course vary from year to year, but this is a light-weight Outside show. Allow four hours driving time from Sea-Tac and enjoy it. It's a good place to begin.

Why dogs don't live as long as people

Being a veterinarian, I had been called to examine a ten-year old Irish Wolfhound named Belker. The dog's owners; Ron, his wife Lisa and their little boy Shane, were all very attached to Belker and they were hoping for a miracle. I examined Belker and found he was dying of cancer.

I told the family there were no miracles left for Belker and offered to perform the euthanasia procedure for the old dog in their home.

As we made arrangements, Ron and Lisa told me they thought it would be good for the four-year-old Shane to observe the procedure. They felt Shane could learn something from the experience.

The next day I felt the familiar catch in my throat as Belker's family surrounded him. Shane seemed so calm, petting the old dog for the last time, that I wondered if he understood what was going on.

Within a few minutes, Belker slipped peacefully away. The little boy seemed to accept Belker's transition without any difficulty or confusion.

We sat together for a while after Belker's death, wondering aloud about the sad fact that animal lives are shorter than human lives.

Shane, who had been listening quietly, piped up, "I know why."

Startled, we all turned to him. What came out of his mouth next stunned me - I'd never heard a more comforting explanation.

He said, "Everybody is born so that they can learn how to live a good life - like loving everybody and being nice, right?" The four-year-old continued, "Well, animals already know how to do that, so they don't have to stay as long."
