CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

(Proposed Revisions, October 30, 2004)

ARTICLE I: NAME AND PURPOSE

Section 1. The name of this club is the Capital Kennel Club of Juneau (hereinafter "the Club").

Section 2. The purposes of the Club are to engage in activities with purebred and mixed breed dogs, to further the well-being of the dog, the pleasure of the owners, the responsible citizenship of dog owners, the development of skills in working with dogs, and the exercise of sportsman-like behavior.

Section 3. All licensed obedience events sponsored by the Club will be run in accordance with rules and policies set forth by the United Kennel Club (UKC), Inc. All licensed agility events will be run in accordance with rules and policies set forth by the North American Dog Agility Conference (NADAC). In no case will a UKC event and a NADAC event be held in the same location on the same day

Section 4. The Club is not conducted nor operated for profit and no part of any profits, dues, or donations may inure to the benefit of any member.

ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. There are four categories of membership:

- a. Regular membership is for all persons eighteen years and older who subscribe to the purposes of

the Club.

- b. Junior membership is for all persons under the age of eighteen years who subscribe to the purposes of the Club. Junior members have all privileges of regular members except that they may neither vote nor hold office on the Board of Directors (hereinafter "the Board").
- c. Family membership is for a group of individuals living as a single household who subscribe to the purposes of the Club. All individuals included in a family membership have all the privileges of regular members except that the family membership is entitled to only one vote.
- d. Champion membership is for persons or households as in II.1.a. or c. with all the privileges except that Champion membership is entitled to one vote in the case of an individual and two votes in the case of a group of individuals.

Section 2. The dues of the Club are set by the Board and approved by the membership at the annual meeting. In the event of a dues increase, memberships that have been renewed prior to the annual meeting shall be "grandfathered" at the previous rate.

Section 3. No person whose dues are not paid as of the date of the event is considered a member of the Club for the purpose of that event. An "event" is defined as any regular or special membership or Board meeting, any Board-scheduled work or discussion session, and any activity voted to be sponsored; and carried out in whole or in part by the Board or membership.

Section 4. Any person wishing to become a member of the club must submit an application for membership along with the required dues.

- a. This application is to be read at the next regular meeting of the Board as its first order-of business and, if no objection is offered by any member, the person is forthwith accepted to membership.
- b. If any objection is raised, the membership application is read at the next regular meeting of the Board where, at a session open to members and the prospective member only, all members present may speak and vote on the issue. The proposed member may also be allowed to speak to answer any substantive objections to membership. A two-thirds affirmative vote of all members present and voting will elect to membership.
- c. If, due to the lack of a quorum, a membership application cannot be approved at the scheduled regular board meeting, the member's name and areas of interest will be published on ckcoj-an-

nounce (the club's email list). The treasurer will be responsible for publishing this information. If no objection is raised by any member within 7 days, the applicant will be forthwith accepted to membership. (added October 12, 2002)

- d. If any objection is raised within 7 days, the candidate's name will be brought up at the next meeting when a quorum is met. The candidate for membership will then be reviewed by the members present at that meeting, as stated in Section 4.b. (added October 12, 2002)

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

Section 1. The annual meeting of the Club is to be held in October in the Greater Juneau area. Members must be notified individually by telephone, mail, or email of the date, time and place of the annual meeting no later than two weeks beforehand. Such notification must also include the names of the candidates recommended for Board positions by the nominating committee and any proposed bylaw changes recommended by the Board. If notice of the annual meeting is published in the Club's September newsletter, individual notification of the Club or board members is not required.

Section 2. The business of the annual meeting is to approve the budget for the next year, to elect a Board, and to conduct such other business as may come before the meeting.

Section 3. The fiscal year of the Club ends on September 30, at which time dues for the succeeding year shall be payable. No member whose dues are not paid for the succeeding year is eligible for election to the Board.

Section 4. Nominations for members of the Board are made by the nominating committee and may also be made from the floor at the annual meeting with the consent of the nominee.

Section 5. The nominees receiving the highest number of votes cast are elected to the Board. In the event of a tie, any nominee having received a majority of the votes cast is declared elected, and a second ballot is taken among the remaining candidates.

Section 6. Special membership meetings may be called by the President.

- a. Special membership meetings may be requested of the President by any two members of the Board or any four members. Such a request must be in writing, stating the purpose of the request. The meeting must be called no later than two weeks after the receipt of the request except as otherwise provided.

- b. All members must be individually notified of the call for a special meeting, its time, place, and purpose, no later than one week beforehand by email, telephone or mail.

Section 7. A quorum for all membership meetings is 50% of the membership entitled to vote.

ARTICLE IV: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Board is comprised of a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Member-at-Large, who shall constitute the officers.

Section 2. Immediately following the annual meeting, the Board must hold a special meeting to determine its officers. These officers take office immediately upon their election.

Section 3. The President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer perform the usual duties of their positions.

Section 4. Any vacancies occurring on the Board are filled by the Board, except that the Vice President automatically succeeds to the office of President.

Section 5. Any removal of a member of the Board must be done at a general membership meeting open only to members following notification as described in III 6b above. The officer whose removal is proposed must be given full opportunity to speak, including the right to participate in selecting the date of the special meeting which may be no later than one month following the request for a meeting.

Section 6. The term of office for Board members is two years, with three members elected in odd-numbered years and two members in even-numbered years. In 1993, the two Board members receiving the lowest number of votes will have one-year terms, or, if all members are elected by acclamation, the members will draw straws for the single-year terms.

ARTICLE V: BOARD MEETINGS

Section 1. The business of the Club is carried on between annual meetings by the Board.

Section 2. All meetings of the Board must be open to all members and prospective members, except as otherwise noted.

Section 3. Board meetings will be set by the Board in policy. If notice of a regular meeting is published in the Club's monthly newsletter, individual notification of the Club or Board members is not required. Any change to the regular meeting will require an advance five-day individual notification of members by telephone, mail, or e-mail.

Section 4. Special Board meetings may be called by the President.

- a. Special meetings of the Board may be requested of the President by any two members of the Board. Such a request must be in writing, stating the purpose of the request. The meeting must be called no later than two weeks after the receipt of the request.
- b. All members, whether or not members of the Board, must be individually notified of the call for a special Board meeting, its time, place, and purpose, no later than one week prior to the meeting by email, telephone or mail.

Section 5. A quorum for all Board meetings is three Board members or 60% of the Board members.

Section 6. All Club members present at any Board meeting who are eligible to vote may vote on any matter. However, only Board members may make or second motions. Any Board member making or seconding a motion must vote in the affirmative for that motion unless it is subsequently amended.

Section 7. The Board may establish policies necessary to specify procedures for carrying out club business at either the annual meeting or a regular meeting.

ARTICLE VI: COMMITTEES

Section 1. Two months before the annual meeting the Board must select a nominating committee of at least three persons, at least one of whom is not a Board member and at least one of whom is not a candidate for any office. (The same person may fulfill both these requirements.) The nominating committee is to make its report to the Board, giving the names of the candidates selected, at the Board meeting before the annual meetings.

Section 2. The Board may appoint such other committees as it deems advisable to carry out the aims of the Club.

ARTICLE VII: AUTHORITY

Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised, is the governing authority in all matters not covered by these bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII: AMENDMENTS

These bylaws may be amended at any regular or special membership meeting by two-thirds vote of the members present and voting, provided notice of the proposed amendment has been given to all members no later than two weeks before the meeting. It is the responsibility of the Board to provide such notice for any amendments recommended by the Board. It is the responsibility of any member or group of members proposing amendments not recommended by the Board to provide such notice.

ARTICLE IX: DISSOLUTION

The Club may be dissolved by a three-fourths vote of the members present and voting at any regular or special membership meeting, provided notice of the intent to dissolve has been given to all members no later than two weeks before the meeting. Any funds remaining after all

POLICIES

(PROPOSED REVISIONS 10/30/2004)

001. Junior or "Puppy" membership age is 10-18 years. At the Puppy level members receive a newsletter subscription, ckcoj-announce and all discounts, but are not entitled to vote. Juniors are encouraged to volunteer for suitable tasks with parental consent, however adult supervision is required for ages 10 to 13.

Adult or "Best Friend" membership is over 18 years of age. At the Best Friend level members receive a newsletter subscription, ckcoj-announce, and are eligible for all discounts and benefits. Members are expected to volunteer for at least one event or position per year.

A family or "Dog Pack" membership option is available when more than one individual within a household are members of the Club. All individuals included in a family membership will have all the rights of regular members except that the family membership will have only one vote. Family members will be listed on the membership application form. Additional members may be added without Board approval. At the Dog Pack level members receive one newsletter per household. All family members receive discounts and benefits as above. Each family participant is expected to volunteer for one event per year.

A sustaining or "Champion" membership option is available to individual adults or families. At the Champion level the same discounts, benefits and expectations as with adult or family memberships apply, except that two people per household will have votes and both voting members are expected to volunteer for an event or a position. "Champion" members shall be listed in all event programs & newsletters. Up to 70% may be allocated to support specified areas of interest: obedience; agility; conformation; public relations and outreach; continuing education & seminars.

002. Membership dues are non-refundable. Annual dues are \$15 for junior members, \$30 for adult members, \$40 for family membership, and \$105 for Champion members. Fourth quarter dues shall be 50% of the annual amount. Memberships may be upgraded at anytime during the year by paying the difference between the membership categories. A \$5 discount will be given to members opting to receive the club newsletter in electronic format. (amended 10/25/03)

003. One member will be appointed as Public Outreach Coordinator and will be responsible for advertisement of events and arrangements for photographing club activities.

The Public Outreach Coordinator is also responsible for maintaining a scrapbook of articles, photos, etc., of club activities.

004. A Resource Inventory (description, goals, time commitments, materials, personnel, funding, chairman, and due date) will be completed for any proposed activity and presented to the Board of Directors at a Board meeting. The Board shall approve the activity before further action is taken.

005. Committee Chairman duties include coordinating all aspects of a project, maintaining a resource inventory, facilitating activities (support, follow-through), evaluating (report), and recognition.

006. Every committee will have a Board member as a committee member, who will report its activities at Board meetings. Committee chairman shall keep the Board member advised of activity status.

007. Board meetings, normally held on the third Thursday of each month, may be changed by vote of the Board members. In the event of a change in the date of such meeting, members will be notified in accordance with Article V, Section 3, of the Bylaws.

008. At any organized club activity that a person applies for membership and there is a discount for club members, the club will give the applicant the member discount rate until or unless they are denied membership.

009. The member who organizes and/or is placed in charge of any event, function or merchandise sale is responsible for the collection, recording and balancing of any and all proceeds received from that event, function or sale before they are presented to the Treasurer for deposit.

010. Anyone who has an outstanding amount payable to the Club for a previous event or activity cannot participate in another one until the debt is paid.

011. A waiver of liability will be included on all registration forms for classes, seminars, practices and other Club events.

Kennel Club reserves the right to reschedule or adjust any class without notice. However, every attempt will be made to contact you in this event.

012. One member will be appointed as club Librarian and will be responsible for storing club reference materials, videos and books and maintaining an inventory of such. The Librarian is also responsible for reasonable arrangements to make the library accessible to the membership.

013. Doggie dollars be awarded to volunteers as follows:

\$30: Instructing a six week class; Seminar organizers; CGC test organizer; Trial Secretary; Trial Chairperson

\$25: Per instructor if a class is co-taught (up to 2 instructors - 6 week class)

\$20: Instructor Assistant in a 6 wk class; Practice session or Class organizer (Liaison) - 6 week session; Annual positions as designated by the Board

\$5: Practice session facilitator; Per month for newsletter producer; Per month for Web Master; Per month for training coordinator; Per month for Board Members; Per day trial Photographer; Per trial for program producer; Per trial for set up crew (paid irregardless of entry status); Per trial for clean up crew (paid irregardless of entry status); Per day for stewards, timers, scribes (who has committed in advance); Per day for miscellaneous volunteer at trial chair's discretion; Per day for pet festival; Per day for pet photo's with Santa; Special Committee Assignments; Speaker at Board Meeting

\$5-60: Annually for other positions as designated by the Board

Doggie dollars can be redeemed toward the purchase of memberships, classes, entry fees, and other goods and services as approved by the board.

In a case where the issuance of Doggie Dollars is unclear, the event organizer should go to the Board for verification. Rule: It is always best to err on the side of generosity.

014. Newsletter subscriptions are available to the general public at the rate of \$20 per subscription per fiscal year. Partial year subscriptions shall be pro-rated.

015. "Dogs deemed 'dangerous' or 'potentially dangerous' by Animal Control may not participate in any CKCOJ class or event." (added October 27, 2001)

016 CKCOJ Newsletter Advertising Policy

CKCOJ distributes a monthly newsletter to all members. From time to time, members or others may wish to place advertisements in the newsletter. This policy sets the conditions under which ads may be placed in the newsletter.

Commercial advertisements that are accepted will be used to subsidize printing and distribution of the newsletter.

Non-commercial classified ads: Members in good standing may, at no charge, submit short dog-related text classified ads of a non-commercial nature for inclusion in the newsletter. Examples might include: used crates or other equipment for sale, brags, litter announcements, homes wanted for rescue dogs, upcoming events of interest, equipment wanted, etc.

What is non-commercial? An activity is considered to be non-commercial if it is not from an activity that is treated as a business on the member's income tax return. A member who owns a commercial business may post a classified ad for an item that is not related to their business activity (e.g. personal equipment for sale).

Commercial advertising: Commercial ads or display advertisements (such as "brags" accompanied by a photo) are accepted from both members and non-members. Members receive a 50% discount off the posted rates. All ads must be provided to the newsletter editor in electronic form. In addition, a hard copy of the ad, along with payment, must be sent to CKCOJ (P.O. Box 32513, Juneau, AK 99803). The ad will be published in the first issue after payment is received. The following rates are charged for ads:

- Business card ads: \$100 per year or \$15 per insertion
- Annual insertion rates are for the CKCOJ fiscal year. Charges for ads placed after the beginning of the fiscal year will be pro-rated.
- Quarter-page: \$25 per insertion
- Half-page: \$40 per insertion
- Full-page: \$70 per insertion

Rights reserved: The newsletter editor or the board reserve the right to reject either non-commercial or commercial ads for any reason, including lack of space or an item or activity being advertised that is contrary to the mission of the organization. When space is limited, new non-commercial ads will be given priority over ads that have been previously published. At this time, no breeder ads or ads offering puppies for sale or placement will be accepted.

017. Trophies and other awards

Ribbons will be provided by CKCoJ for all trials. It is up to the discretion of the trial chair as to whether trophies will be awarded at the event. It is up to the trial chair or committee to raise any funds necessary to purchase trophies. ~~(October 12, 2002)~~ **The Board may authorize a trial chair to spend up to \$50 (Fifty Dollars) for trophies or awards for the event. (Proposed Revision, October 30, 2004)**

018. Training Policy

Although there is some overlap, classes fall into two general categories -- "manners" classes designed to help the owner live with a well-mannered dog, and "hobby" classes

designed to allow the owner to participate in some aspect of competitive dog activity.

It is the explicit policy of the club that, with the exceptions below, no training method is endorsed or banned. Instructors may teach any method or combination of methods that in their experience they find effective.

"Hobby" classes are expected to be enjoyable to the dog as well as the trainer. Therefore, no instructor of these classes may teach, demonstrate, advocate, or allow to be used in the class any harsh method, such as that which may cause physical pain or fear to the dog. "Manners" classes are for the purpose of making the dog safe and pleasant to live with. Instructors in those classes may use the minimum force necessary to achieve that purpose, taking into account, the size, breed, age, background, and temperament of the dog, and the size and strength of the handler. Harsh methods will not be advocated. (adopted January 14, 2003)
