## CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

*(Proposed Revisions October 29, 2005)*

### ARTICLE I: NAME AND PURPOSE

**Section 1.** The name of this club is the Capital Kennel Club of Juneau (hereinafter "the Club").

**Section 2.** The purposes of the Club are to engage in activities with purebred and mixed breed dogs, to further the well-being of the dog, the pleasure of the owners, the responsible citizenship of dog owners, the development of skills in working with dogs, and the exercise of sportsmanlike behavior.

**Section 3.** All licensed obedience events sponsored by the Club will be run in accordance with rules and policies set forth by the United Kennel Club UKC, Inc. All licensed agility events will be run in accordance with rules and policies set forth by the North American Dog Agility Conference (NADAC). In no case will a UKC event and a NADAC event be held in the same location on the same day

**Section 4.** The Club is not conducted nor operated for profit and no part of any profits, dues, or donations may inure to the benefit of any member.

### ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP

**Section 1.** There are four categories of membership:

- a. Regular membership is for all persons eighteen years and older who subscribe to the purposes of the Club.
- b. Junior membership is for all persons under the age of eighteen years who subscribe to the purposes of the Club. Junior members have all privileges of regular members except that they may neither vote nor hold office on the Board of Directors (hereinafter "the Board").
- c. Family membership is for a group of individuals living as a single household who subscribe to the purposes of the Club. All individuals included in a family membership have all the privileges of regular members except that the family membership is entitled to only one vote.

Champion membership is for persons or households as in II.1.a. or c. with all the privileges except that Champion membership is entitled to one vote in the case of an individual and two votes in the case of a group of individuals.

**Section 2.** The dues of the Club are set by the Board and approved by the membership at the annual meeting. In the event of a dues increase, memberships that have been renewed prior to the annual meeting shall be "grandfathered" at the previous rate.

**Section 3.** No person whose dues are not paid as of the date of the event is considered a member of the Club for the purpose of that event. An "event" is defined as any regular or special membership or Board meeting, any Board-scheduled work or discussion session, and any activity voted to be sponsored; and carried out in whole or in part by the Board or membership.

**Section 4.** Any person wishing to become a member of the club must submit an application for membership along with the required dues.

- a. This application is to be read at the next regular meeting of the Board as its first order-of business and, if no objection is offered by any member, the person is forthwith accepted to membership.
  - b. If any objection is raised, the membership application is read at the next regular meeting of the Board where, at a session open to members and the prospective member only, all members present may speak and vote on the issue. The proposed member may also be allowed to speak to answer any substantive objections to membership. A two-thirds affirmative vote of all members present and voting will elect to membership.
  - c. If, due to the lack of a quorum, a membership application cannot be approved at the scheduled regular board meeting, the member's name and areas of interest will be published on ckcoj-announce (the club's email list). The treasurer will be responsible for publishing this information. If no objection is raised by any member within 7 days, the applicant will be forthwith accepted to membership. (added October 12, 2002)
- If any objection is raised within 7 days, the candi-

date's name will be brought up at the next meeting when a quorum is met. The candidate for membership will then be reviewed by the members present at that meeting, as stated in Section 4.b. (added October 12, 2002)

### **ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS**

**Section 1.** The annual meeting of the Club is to be held in October in the Greater Juneau area. Members must be notified individually by telephone, mail, or email of the date, time and place of the annual meeting no later than two weeks beforehand. Such notification must also include the names of the candidates recommended for Board positions by the nominating committee and any proposed bylaw changes recommended by the Board. If notice of the annual meeting is published in the Club's September newsletter, individual notification of the Club or board members is not required.

**Section 2.** The business of the annual meeting is to approve the budget for the next year, to elect a Board, and to conduct such other business as may come before the meeting.

**Section 3.** The fiscal year of the Club ends on September 30, at which time dues for the succeeding year shall be payable. No member whose dues are not paid for the succeeding year is eligible for election to the Board.

**Section 4.** Nominations for members of the Board are made by the nominating committee and may also be made from the floor at the annual meeting with the consent of the nominee.

**Section 5.** The nominees receiving the highest number of votes cast are elected to the Board. In the event of a tie, any nominee having received a majority of the votes cast is declared elected, and a second ballot is taken among the remaining candidates.

**Section 6.** Special membership meetings may be called by the President.

a. Special membership meetings may be requested of the President by any two members of the Board or any four members. Such a request must be in writing, stating the purpose of the request. The meeting must

be called no later than two weeks after the receipt of the request except as otherwise provided.

All members must be individually notified of the call for a special meeting, its time, place, and purpose, no later than one week beforehand by email, telephone or mail.

**Section 7.** A quorum for all membership meetings is 50% of the membership entitled to vote.

### **ARTICLE IV: BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

**Section 1.** The Board is comprised of a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Member-at-Large, who shall constitute the officers.

**Section 2.** Immediately following the annual meeting, the Board must hold a special meeting to determine its officers. These officers take office immediately upon their election.

**Section 3.** The President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer perform the usual duties of their positions.

**Section 4.** Any vacancies occurring on the Board are filled by the Board, except that the Vice President automatically succeeds to the office of President.

**Section 5.** Any removal of a member of the Board must be done at a general membership meeting open only to members following notification as described in III 6b above. The officer whose removal is proposed must be given full opportunity to speak, including the right to participate in selecting the date of the special meeting which may be no later than one month following the request for a meeting.

**Section 6.** The term of office for Board members is two years, with three members elected in odd-numbered years and two members in even-numbered years. In 1993, the two Board members receiving the lowest number of votes will have one-year terms, or, if all members are elected by acclamation, the members will draw straws for the single-year terms.

### **ARTICLE V: BOARD MEETINGS**

**Section 1.** The business of the Club is carried on between annual meetings by the Board.

---

**Section 2.** All meetings of the Board must be open to all members and prospective members, except as otherwise noted.

**Section 3.** Board meetings will be set by the Board in policy. If notice of a regular meeting is published in the Club's monthly newsletter, individual notification of the Club or Board members is not required. Any change to the regular meeting will require an advance five-day individual notification of members by telephone, mail, or e-mail.

**Section 4.** Special Board meetings may be called by the President.

a. Special meetings of the Board may be requested of the President by any two members of the Board. Such a request must be in writing, stating the purpose of the request. The meeting must be called no later than two weeks after the receipt of the request.

All members, whether or not members of the Board, must be individually notified of the call for a special Board meeting, its time, place, and purpose, no later than one week prior to the meeting by email, telephone or mail.

**Section 5.** A quorum for all Board meetings is three Board members or 60% of the Board members.

**Section 6.** All Club members present at any Board meeting who are eligible to vote may vote on any matter. However, only Board members may make or second motions. Any Board member making or seconding a motion must vote in the affirmative for that motion unless it is subsequently amended.

**Section 7.** The Board may establish policies necessary to specify procedures for carrying out club business at either the annual meeting or a regular meeting. The proposed policy will be published in the club newsletter and/or the club website before it is adopted by the Board. (*proposed by S. Hoffman*)

## ARTICLE VI: COMMITTEES

**Section 1.** Two months before the annual meeting the Board must select a nominating committee of at least three persons, at least one of whom is not a Board member and at least one of whom is not a candidate for any office. (The same person may fulfill

both these requirements.) The nominating committee is to make its report to the Board, giving the names of the candidates selected, at the Board meeting before the annual meetings.

**Section 2.** The Board may appoint such other committees as it deems advisable to carry out the aims of the Club.

## ARTICLE VII: AUTHORITY

Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised, is the governing authority in all matters not covered by these bylaws.

## ARTICLE VIII: AMENDMENTS

These bylaws may be amended at any regular or special membership meeting by two-thirds vote of the members present and voting, provided notice of the proposed amendment has been given to all members no later than two weeks before the meeting. It is the responsibility of the Board to provide such notice for any amendments recommended by the Board. It is the responsibility of any member or group of members proposing amendments not recommended by the Board to provide such notice.

## ARTICLE IX: DISSOLUTION

The Club may be dissolved by a three-fourths vote of the members present and voting at any regular or special membership meeting, provided notice of the intent to dissolve has been given to all members no later than two weeks before the meeting. Any funds remaining after all debts have been paid will be donated to the Gastineau Humane Society, or, in the event that the dissolution is for the purpose of reorganization into a similar club, organized for the benefit of dogs and their owners and not for profit, transferred to the new club by consent of at least two-thirds of the membership present and voting.

# Minutes

- I. The regular monthly meeting of the Capital Kennel Club of Juneau board was held on Thursday, September 15, 2005, at 6:32 p.m., at the Mendenhall Public Library. The President had the chair and the Vice President, Secretary, and Member-at-large were present. Other members present were Margaret Webb, Susan Hoffman, Jill Grose, and Vicky McLaughlin.
- II. Consent agenda
  - A. The agenda was amended and approved.
  - B. There were no new members this month.
  - C. Corrections to September's minutes:
    - a. Kathy Hocker will be compensated for her artwork that will be a prize at RDO Day by the Grateful Dogs, not CKCOJ.
    - b. The board did not approve the liability waiver, as that is a change of policy and must be voted on at the annual meeting. The board agreed it was ready to present to membership for a vote.
  - D. There was one amendment to the treasurer's report. The (\$283.23) figure on the obedience trial run-through line should be on the obedience practice line, which makes the total on the practice line (\$271.25).
- III. Routine updates
  - A. There was no correspondence.
  - B. Event planning updates
    - a. The forms have been posted on the web site for the John Rogerson seminar.
    - b. Gina presented the February 2006 UKC trial proposal (event budget), which is attached. The estimate is that the event will break even.

- She requested \$25 to purchase UKC score sheets and 2 rule books, which received unanimous consent.
- c. The annual meeting will be October 29. St. Brendan's is reserved from 4:30 till 9 p.m. The schedule is in September's newsletter. Camille suggested that we set some club goals and create a rough spending plan or budget. Elections will be held for two board positions: terms are expiring for Gina Vose and Marty Messick. Nominees who have agreed to run are Margaret Webb, George Utermohle, Vicky McLaughlin, and Marty Messick. The new board will appoint someone to finish Camille's term, since she has resigned effective October 29<sup>th</sup>.
- IV. Discussion items
    - A. Gina inquired of a tax accountant whether honorariums, rewards, or incentives were taxable income, and the tax implications for the club. The response was that they are taxable income to the recipient, and that we would have to issue a 1099-misc., and even raised the possibility of needing W-2's and other employer forms. Her e-mail and the response are attached.

Camille moved that these 6 policies drafted by the education committee be published in the October newsletter for action at the annual meeting, which was unanimously approved.

      - h. Policy 005 – revisions to the duties of the event chairperson

Camille moved that these 2 policy revisions drafted by Gina be published in the October newsletter for action at the annual meeting, which was unanimously approved.
    - B. Gina suggested that the club purchase front clip harnesses in assorted sizes for instructors to make available in their classes. By purchasing 30, we get a price break. Dee Ann moved that Gina spend up to \$400 for harnesses, which passed unanimously.
    - C. Susan moved that we send \$300 to the Louisiana Veterinary Medical Association to assist with animal rescue and care in the aftermath of Katrina, which passed unanimously.
  - VI. The next meeting will be held on October 29<sup>th</sup> at St. Brendan's church, in conjunction with our annual meeting.
  - VII. The meeting was adjourned at 7:29 p.m.

## **Revised Polices and New Policies Proposals:**

**004.** The Event Cost Planning Proposal (the proposal) shall be completed for any proposed activity involving financial and/or physical assets of the club. The proposal shall include the name, location, chairperson, estimated funding expenses and estimated funding sources for the proposed activity. The proposal shall be approved by the board before commitment of any club assets are made.

The proposal shall be submitted to the Secretary, or another board member, and so noted in the meeting minutes. The proposal shall be maintained by the Secretary of the club with the meeting minutes with which the proposal was submitted. (*proposed by G. Vose*)

**005.** The chairperson of a board-approved planned event is responsible for coordinating all aspects of the event. Chair duties include, but are not limited to, fiscal responsibility, equipment management, facility coordination and preparedness, volunteer coordination, reporting event results (financial and otherwise), and if any, requests by the board relevant to the event. The chairperson may delegate some of these duties to another club member; however, the chairperson is ultimately responsible for the aforementioned duties. (*proposed by G. Vose*)

## **The Policy changes below were submitted by the Education Committee.**

**Revised: 008.** Club membership begins when an application is approved by the Board of Directors. Therefore, at any organized club activity where a person applies for membership and there is a discount for club members, the discount does not apply until *after* the membership application is approved.

**Policy 011.** A waiver of liability will be included on all registration forms for classes, seminars, practices and other Club events.

Proposed addition to Policy 011

A waiver of liability will be included on all registration forms for classes, seminars, practices and other Club events. The club secretary will keep the signed waivers for one year following the end of each classes, seminars, practices and events.

**Revised: 013.** As an incentive to encourage volunteers, CKCoJ may award doggie dollars to members who volunteer for club events. Volunteers do not have the right to them. Doggie Dollars will be awarded depending upon the financial well being of the club and must be approved by the Board of Directors on an annual basis.. The following schedule is for awarding doggie dollars:

**\$15** per individual class for instructors and **\$10** per individual class for class assistants

**\$30** Per event, such as a 2-trial weekend, 2 day CGC test, weekend seminar for the chairperson of these events. If there are co-chairpersons, the amount is split between the two members. If an event is longer than two days, the doggie dollars will be prorated.

**\$15** Per month for those months the activities are performed for the Facilities Liaison for Mt Jumbo (CBJ Parks & Rec Dept)

**\$20** Per month for those months the activities are performed for the Facilities Liaison for Community Schools

- Board Member
- Training Coordinator
- Webmaster
- Special Committee Assignments

**\$5 Per Trial:**

- Photographer
- Set up crew (paid irregardless of entry status)

**\$10 for over 4 Hours:**

- Stewards
- Timers
- Scribes

**\$5 Per Event:**

- Practice session facilitator
- Practice Judge

**\$5 Per Day:**

- Pet Festival/Responsible Dog Owners Day volunteers
- Pet Photos w/Santa volunteers
- Miscellaneous volunteers

**New Policy #20:** Class instructors, co-instructors and assistants will be awarded free membership if they have fulfilled the following criteria:

Instructors and co-instructors must have taught at least one six-week class within the past twelve (12) months. Assistants must have assisted in at least three (3) six week classes during the past twelve (12) months.

**New Policy #21:** Refunds, other than membership dues, will be granted for any reason for public classes, seminars, or trials (prior to exhibiting the dog) when requested by the participant. In cases where a practice is a break-even event, refunds will be left up to the discretion of the coordinator. It is always best to err on the side of generosity.

### TYPES OF MEMBERSHIPS AVAILABLE

**Adult or "Best Friend":** Open to all persons over 18 years of age who subscribe to the purposes of the club. Regular membership entitles members to voting privileges, receive a newsletter subscription, participate in email lists and are eligible for all discounts and benefits. Members are expected to volunteer for at least one event or position a year. Annual dues for the regular membership are \$30.00.

**Junior or "Puppy":** Open to all persons 10-18 years of age. At the "Puppy" level members receive a newsletter subscription, participate in email lists and all discounts, but are not entitled to vote. Juniors are encouraged to volunteer for suitable tasks with parental consent; however, supervision is required for 10-13. Annual dues for junior membership are \$15.00.

**Family or "Dog Pack":** Available to individuals within a single household. All individuals in a family membership will have all rights and responsibilities of regular members except the family membership will have only one vote. Annual dues for the family membership are \$40.00.

**"Champion":** This membership option is available to individual adults or families. At the Championship level the same discounts, benefits and expectations as with the adult or family memberships apply, except that two people will have votes and both voting members are expected to volunteer for an event or position. "Champion" members shall be listed in all event programs and newsletter. Up to 70% may be allocated to support areas of interest. Annual dues for the champion membership are \$105.00.
